Fishing Not Bad In Spite of Water Conditions



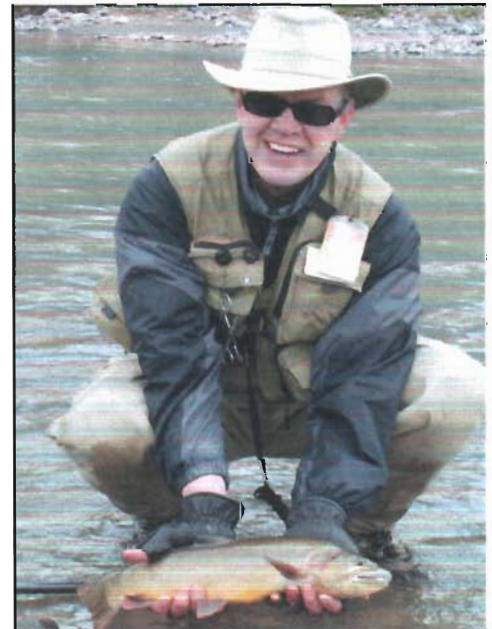
Your bumbling secretary managed to catch a few when conditions were right. The fishing was that good!

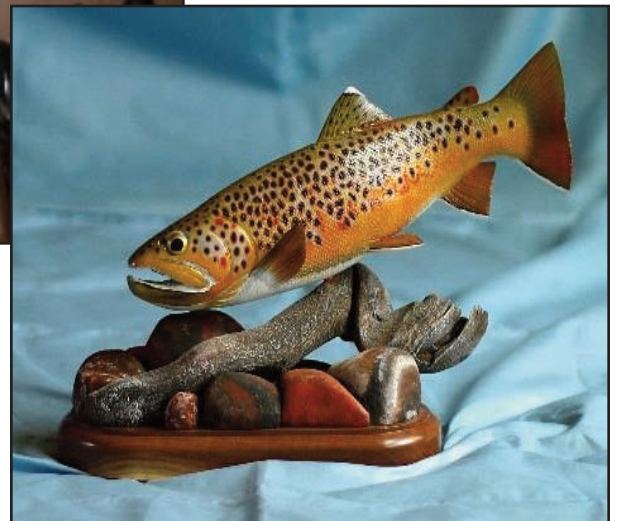
